Round 3 Taupo Sunday 23rd November 2019

The forecast was for fine weather and that's what we got with the day getting hotter and hotter as it went on.

We had a smallish entry with 8 members including new club member Bruce Dreadon in his black 64 Mustang and a guest appearance by Russell Dunn in his XY Falcon. Qualifying went well and because it was cool and the tyres were not yet destroyed by Taupo's abrasive surface most drivers recorded their best times during this season. Fastest was Tony G in the Charger with a 1.37.1, followed by the very crisp sounding Torana of Clarke Hopkins at 1.38.2 and then Allan in his Commodore at 1:40.4

Race 1

The cars did not quite line up as they qualified; Tony G had to start from pit lane due to a clothing malfunction. Clarke roared off into the distance initially followed by Allan then Russell but rising oil temperatures in the Commodore caused Allan to slow being passed near the end by Russell. Tony meanwhile was charging through the field to ultimately finish second to Clarke.

In Class B however things were much more tightly fought between Chris Anderson, in his black 78 Mustang, Craig in his 72 XU-1 Torana and Andrew Ross in his 85 Pinepac replica XE Falcon, however Andrew began to slow on lap 3 retiring on lap 4 with what was later diagnosed as a broken rocker stud.

Race 2

This was a handicap race which was comfortably won by Craig in the XU-1 as the faster cars were unable to get anywhere near the times they set in qualifying Tony G for example being 5 seconds a lap slower and Clarke 3 seconds a lap slower and so it was that the two Class B cars of Craig and Chris lead the way home with Colin in the big block Corvette third.

Race 3

By our final race of the day which was combined with the Racing Saloons Tony G managed to get to the front on the last lap after bolting on some new tyres, again the best fought battle was in Class B with Chris just managing to get past Craig into the lead to then be swallowed up by the Tony's Charger, Chris however trying a very late braking move to repass the Charger only to spin at the very end of the back straight allowing Craig into second overall, Chris recovered quickly though and was able to hold onto third. The current standings are:

NICK CASSIDYTRIUMPS IN FIRST "DREAM RACE"

Nick Cassidy triumphs in first 'Dream Race' between DTM and Super GT MotorNews.co.nz 10:36 am November 24, 2019

Lexus Team KeePer TOM's driver Nick Cassidy converted pole position into a race one victory at the DTM/SuperGT 'Dream Race' at Fuji Speedway, ahead of Honda Keihin Real Racing's Kudai Tsukakoshi and Honda Team Kunimitsu's Naoki Yamamoto.

Drama before the grid formed as Audi Sport Team Phoenix's Loïc Duval who was due to start from second spun on his warm up lap and suffered damage to the front of the car.

This left Cassidy with a much clearer run from the rolling start down to the tight Turn One. The New Zealand driver held on to his lead and swiftly sought about building a gap of around five seconds after around ten minutes of racing.

Audi Sport René Rast climbed from 14th into the top ten in the opening tours, and after 15 minutes of racing was locked in a three-car battle for fifth with Lexus Team au TOM's Yuhi Sekiguchi and Lexus Team Lemans Wako's Kenta Yamashita.

Audi Sport Team Phoenix's Mike Rockefeller found himself slipping down the order from his fifth place on the grid, and was battling with BMW Team RBM's Kamui Kobayashi for 11th position before the pit stops begun.

Rast started losing time, losing out to Nissan NISMO's Ronnie Quintarelli and Lexus Team Zent Cerumo driver Yuji Tachikawa, and took to the pitlane with 33 minutes to go for his mandatory stop.

Race leader Cassidy was the last to pit, making his compulsory visit to change Hankook tyres with 22 minutes to go, but such was the pace of the 2019 SuperGT runner-up that he emerged from the incredibly long Fuji pitlane with a six second lead over closest challenger Tsukakoshi.

Marco Wittmann looked to have gained through the pit cycle, but a sudden drop in pace forced the BMW Team RBM squad to call him in for a second pitstop.

Cassidy looked to be managing a five second lead, but the race would turn on its head with eight minutes remaining as the safety car was deployed for the stranded Nissan GT-R NISMO GT500 of Team Impul's Daiki Sasaki who stopped near the exit of pitlane.

The race would resume with two-and-a-half minutes to spare, and the charge down into Turn One following the Indy-style restart was relatively controlled as Cassidy held onto his lead.

Further back Audi Sport Team WRT Hitotsuyama driver Benoît Tréluyer battled through from 14th at the restart to finish sixth. The Frenchman executing several fantastic moves and benefitting from an incident involving Rockenfeller, who was battling for ninth, being spun out at Turn 10.

Rast would finish the race in eighth place, only three tenths behind Tréluyer in a three-way battle to the line with Sekiguchi who split the two DTM drivers.

Incredibly, Honda Team Mugen's Hideki Mutoh would finish the race in tenth place from last on the grid after a near complete rebuild of the car following a massive crash in qualifying. Rockenfeller would cross the line in 13th place after that spin three laps from the end, less than two tenths ahead of Kobayashi in 14th and Wittmann would finish the race a lap down in 18th position after a second visit to pitlane.

BMW Team RBM's Alex Zanardi was forced to retire with an engine issue after half-race distance. The Italian driver gained positions at the start, but the mechanical issue brought about a disappointing end to Zanardi's race.
