ALL CLASSIC JAPANESE SERIES - ROUND 4

Round 4 saw another excellent entry for a Taupo meeting of 20 cars. Grant Benns, in a first for ACJS with his MX5 NB model, joined us a guest driver for the first time, and Dion Clerke switched allegiances from Production Race for the day.

For the November Taupo meeting, Chris Hillier had just collected his new series 6 Mazda RX7, but a couple of months later he was starting to get to grips with the power of the turbocharged rotary and took out Group 1 from Bryce Richards and Scott Curtis. John Harvey, Grant Richards and Jason Brown had a race long battle, finishing in that order just two seconds apart for Group 2 honours. Sean Midgen led Bryce Bindon over the line for Invitation, but a 10 second time penalty for Sean for a jumped start gave the win to Bryce with Rex Alder third.

In the first of the handicap races Linda Grey just managed to hold off Bryce Richards to win Group 1, with Brittany Sheweiry third. Brittany was first on the track, but broke out of her handicap, incurring a 10 second time penalty post-race. Handicap breakout penalties also affected the result of Group 2 and Invitation, with Rob Mullins and Scott Mills being penalised. John Harvey again took the Group 2 win with Rob Mullins and Jason Brown second and third respectively. In Invitation, Sean Midgen was going well to peg back a 1m 52s handicap before a throttle cable problem brought him to a halt coming out of turn 5. This left Bryce Bindon to cut through the field to take second overall and first in Invitation. Despite his 10 second penalty Scott Mills took second and Rex Alder third.

In the third race Bryce Richards reversed the result of race 2 to beat home Linda Grey by three seconds, with James Smith third. Rob Mullins took full advantage of his handicap to beat David Crook by just two seconds, with a hard charging Grant Richards less than 0.2 seconds behind. Sean Midgen had a meeting to forget, after not being able to complete the warm up lap. This allowed Bryce Binden to take a clean sweep of wins for Invitation with Rex Alder and Scott Mills second and third respectively.

FORMULA JUNIOR - ROUND 4

Formula Juniors again made their way to Taupo for Saturday February 8th meeting. As we travelled south in convoy we remarked how neat it was to be on the road again and to see other competitors and cars heading north to the Leadfoot Festival and the Ellerslie Concours.

The race day was proceeded on Friday by a track day put on by the Bruce McLaren Motorsport Park at Taupo. Messes Tolich (Jocko Special), Herrick (Lola Mk2, Sexton (Stanguellini) and Halford (Auto Sud) arrived throughout the course of Friday where they enjoyed the full International track for three 20 minute sessions in the morning and as many sessions as they wanted on the shortened circuit all afternoon...all for the princely sum of just\$150. This was timely with Neil Tolich keen to test the recent suspension and wheel alignment work done on the Jocko, Roger Herrick keen to try his Mk2 Lola's new 1100 cc engine and Michael Sexton keen to test the Stanguellini after an engine rebuild post the valve insert damage incurred at Timaru's Levels Race Circuit during the 2019 Southern Tour. The Stanguellini also having major work done to both its front and rear suspension.

Friday had its share of FJ ups and downs! First up the Jocko broke one of the front torsion bar mounts. However this was very quickly remedied by a local race car engineer and the Jocko went on to perform with great distinction. The Lola unfortunately had a cooling system issue which culminated in a blown head gasket much to all our dismay. The Stanguellini performed well, the new engine strong and sweet and the handling much improved with the back axle now turning into the corner under load rather than out as was happening previously, courtesy of wrongly set up rear link bars.

Allan Cattle (Volpini), Gary Langsford (Elva 100) and Tony Olissoff (Brabham F3) all arrived in Taupo later on Friday.

Race day brought a fine summers day with a lovely breeze and typical Auckland Car Club efficiency. Qualifying had the grid line up as Olissoff, Halford, Tolich, Sexton, Langsford, Herrick, Cattle. Race 1 had Halford being the first front engine FJ followed by Tolich, Langsford, Cattle and then Sexton, the latter just circulating to finish the race after a significant body part failure – this not being the 61 year old Stanguellini, but rather its 69 year old pilot! Having over tightened his belts at the start of the race, he managed to badly pull a shoulder muscle as he grabbed a gear during battle and this sadly ruled him out of any further racing for the day.

The Jocko, Auto Sud and Elva 100 put on a great display of very close FJ racing with the Brabham in the middle for much of the time and the Volpini not to far back at all. The finish order was the same for the following two races, but with the battle getting tighter and tighter.
