STANDARD SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

PART ONE

1. JURISDICTION:

This event is a Basic Status Event promoted by the Auckland Car Club to be held at Pukekohe Park.

The Meeting will be held under these Supplementary Regulations, the MotorSport New Zealand National Sporting Code and its Appendices and Schedules particularly Appendix Five, Schedule C being the Standing Regulations for all ClubSport Events and Appendix Two, Schedule A – Driver and Vehicle Safety Requirements.

The MotorSport NZ Permit Number is 210105.

3. EVENT DESCRIPTION:

3.1. The event will be a grass motorkhana held in Corporate Carpark A at Pukekohe Park. Three courses will be run concurrently in the morning with three different courses in the afternoon.

3.2. Classes:

Vehicles will be divided into the following classes:

- Class A 0-1300cc
- Class B 1301-1600cc
- Class C 1601-2500cc
- Class D 2500cc and up
- Class E Four wheel drive (4WD)

4. ENTRIES:

4.1. Entries:

Entries should be made through the Auckland Car Club on-line entry system (<https://www.aucklandcarclub.co.nz/entry/login.php>) or by manual entry forms available on the Auckland Car Club web site (<http://www.aucklandcarclub.org.nz/i/images/Entry%20Form%20-%20Fillable.pdf>).

Entries will be accepted on the day and forms will be available at the venue.

Any entry will not be deemed valid until payment is received.

Organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry in accordance with the prescribed provisions of the National Sporting Code.

4.2. Opening and Closing Dates:

Entries open with the publication of these regulations and close at 2:00pm on the day of the event.

4.3. Entry Fees:

The entry fee for non-Auckland Car Club Members for this event is \$35, including GST, per competitor.

The entry fee for Auckland Car Club Members for this event is \$30, including GST, per competitor.

Cheques will not be accepted.

An EFTPOS machine will be available at the venue.

4.4. Number of Starters:

The maximum number of starters will be 36. Any additional entries received will be placed on the reserve list in order of receipt.

5. COMPETITOR REQUIREMENTS and UNDERSTANDING:

5.1. Licence Requirements:

All drivers must hold a current club membership of a Member club, except for new entrants to motorsport, who may compete in two (2) Basic Status Events before being required to join a club.

Any competitor between the ages 12-16 years who does not hold a valid MotorSport New Zealand competition licence may be allowed to compete on the following conditions:

- (a) That the venue restrictions along with the vehicle type and cubic capacity restrictions detailed in Appendix One Schedule L Part One Article 3.2(2) are respected, and
- (b) Only at the discretion of the Event Clerk of the Course.

If the Entrant is other than a driver, an Entrants licence in the name of the Entrant is required.

5.2. Competitor Understanding:

In submitting the entry, competitors (Entrant and Drivers) are deemed to fully understand the MotorSport New Zealand National Sporting Code and its relevant Appendices and Schedules.

In particular:

- The National Sporting Code Articles pertaining to protests and competitors' obligations, and
- Appendix Five, Schedule C.

5.3. Safety Apparel:

Safety apparel is not required.

6. ELIGIBLE VEHICLES

6.1. Compliance:

All vehicles shall as a minimum be to a warrantable standard, with a securely mounted seat, safe steering and effective brakes. The Clerk of the Course has discretionary powers as to the type of vehicle deemed suitable for the venue.

7. DOCUMENTATION & SCRUTINEERING AUDIT INSPECTION

7.1. Documentation:

Will take place at the venue commencing at 8:00am and concluding at 2:00pm (to allow for late entries).

7.2. Scrutineering Audit Inspection:

Will take place at the venue commencing at 8:00am and concluding at 2:00pm (to allow for late entries). Competitors will be advised at Documentation if their vehicle has been selected for audit.

7.3. Drivers' Briefing:

This will be held at the venue commencing at 8:45am. Attendance by all drivers is compulsory – a roll call will be taken and failure to attend will result in a penalty.

8. POSTPONEMENT CANCELLATION ABANDONMENT & ORGANISERS' RIGHTS:

8.1. Pursuant to national Sporting Code Article 13, the organisers advise that if less than 20 entries are received by the entry closing date the meeting may be postponed or cancelled.

9. OFFICIAL BULLETINS:

9.1. Official Bulletins may be issued in accordance with the provisions of the National Sporting Code.

10. GENERAL INFORMATION:

10.1. Penalties:

Situation	Penalty
Failing to navigate the course correctly.	Competitors will be assigned the slowest time for the course plus five seconds
Failing to stop completely within the boundary of the garage.	
Failure to complete the course (DNF).	
Knocking over one or more cones.	Time for the run plus five seconds for each cone knocked over.

10.2. Results:

For each course, competitors will be allowed one practice run and two timed runs. The best time from the timed runs will be used for the official results.

If time allows, competitors will be allowed additional runs, which will be timed, but the times will not be used for the official results.

10.3. Passengers:

May only be carried in accordance with Appendix Five, Schedule C, Part 2, Article 6.4 (i.e. for driver coaching at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course).

10.4. Alcohol:

Alcohol is not permitted to be consumed by any competitor or their crew at the event before or during the day's competition.

10.5. Venue:

The area to be used for the event is Corporate Carpark A shown with grey and white lines:

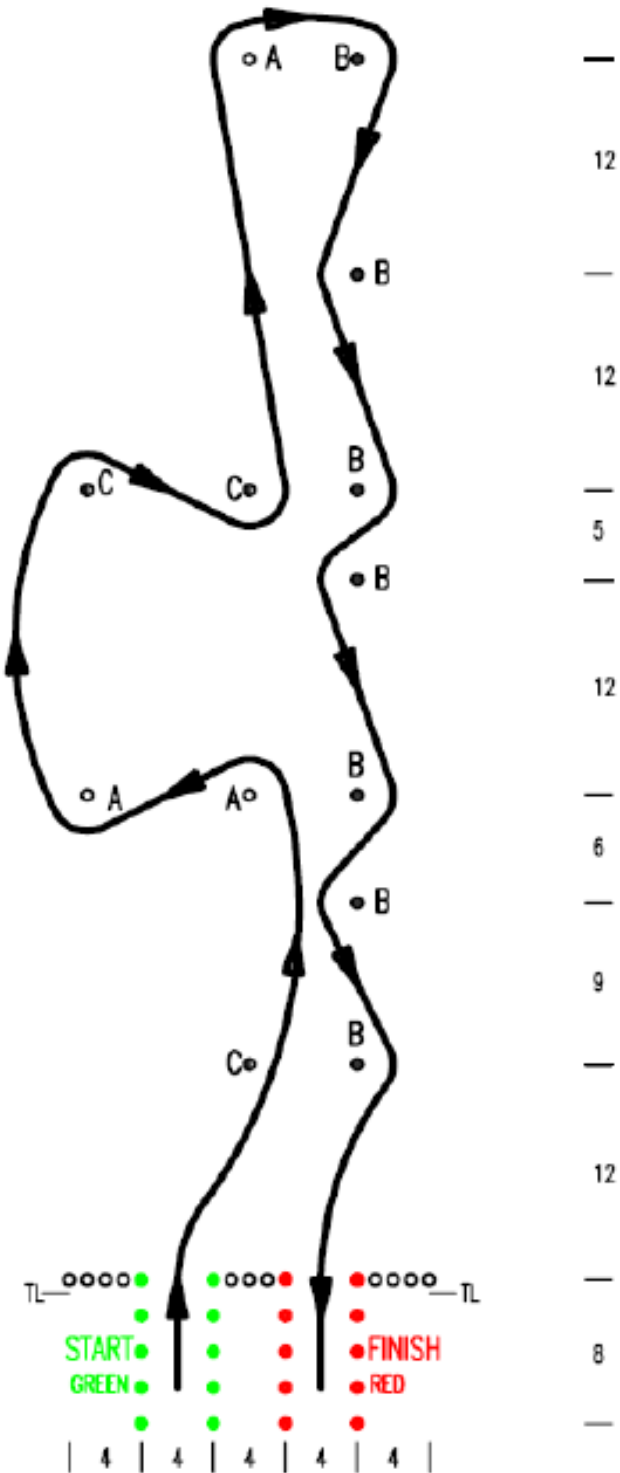

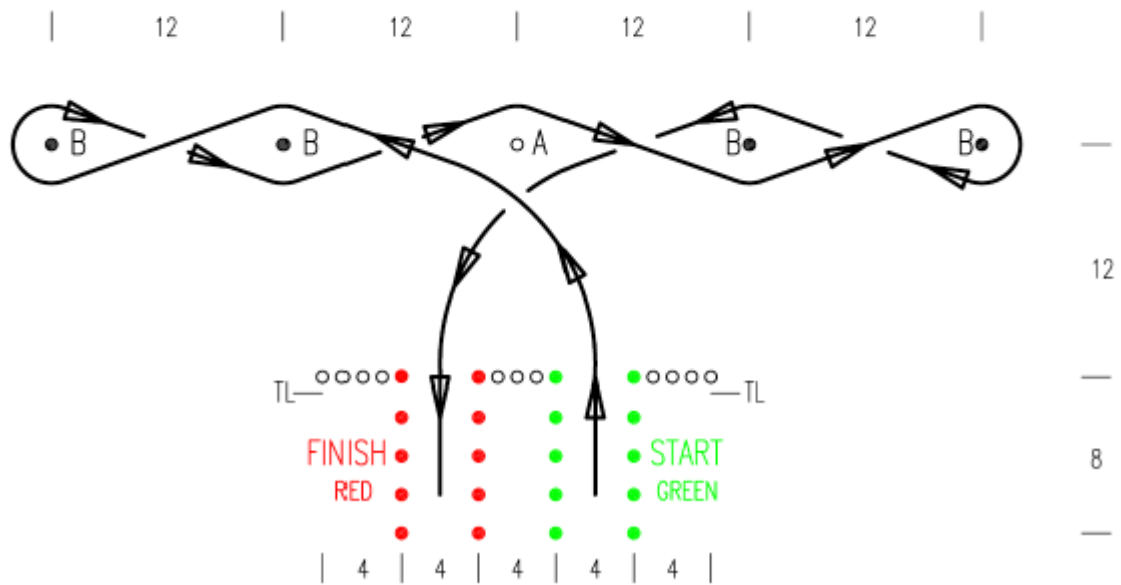
Timing line (0.5 - 1m) $\overline{\text{TL}}$

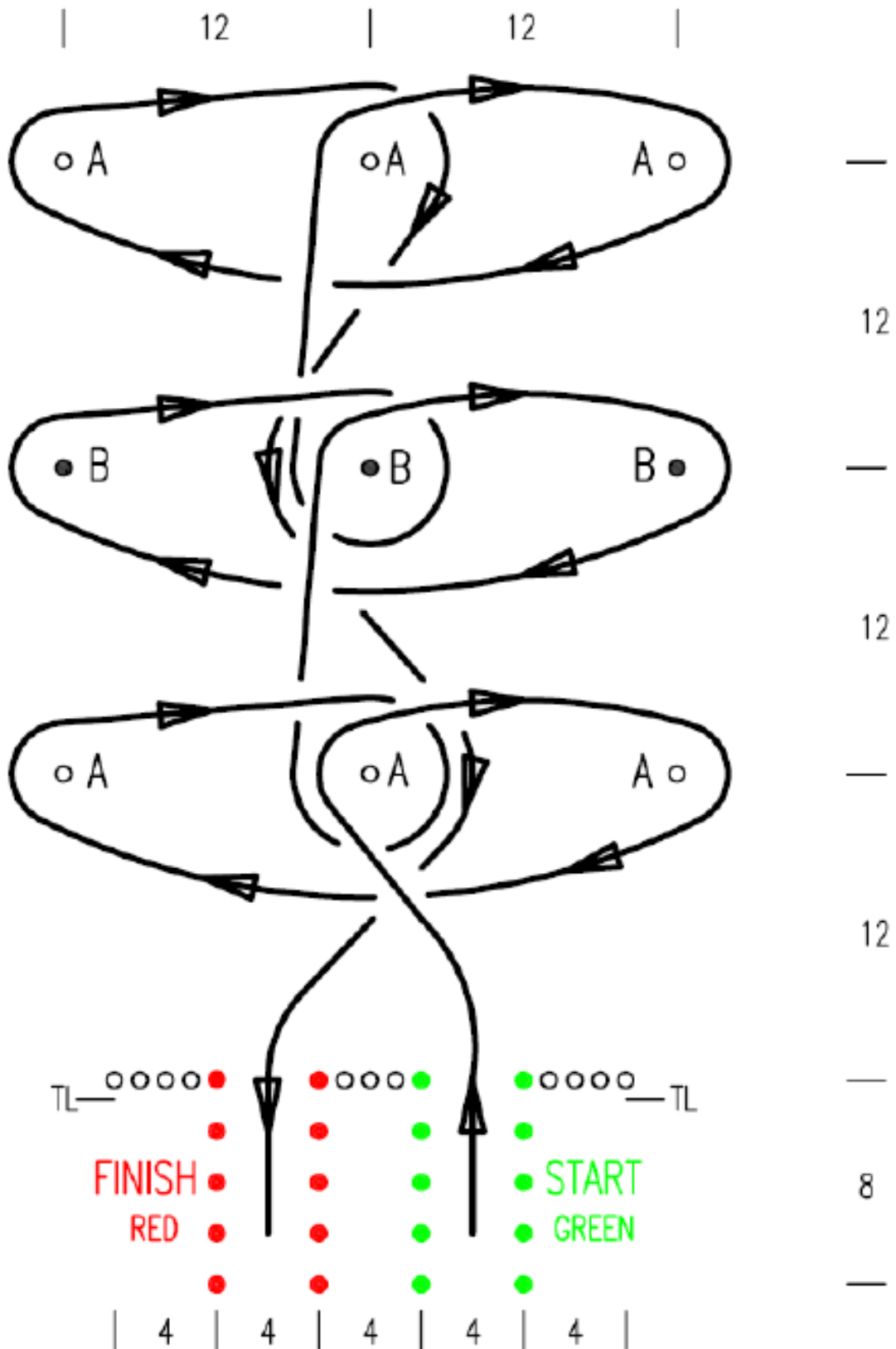
TEE SLALOM

 Width 24m



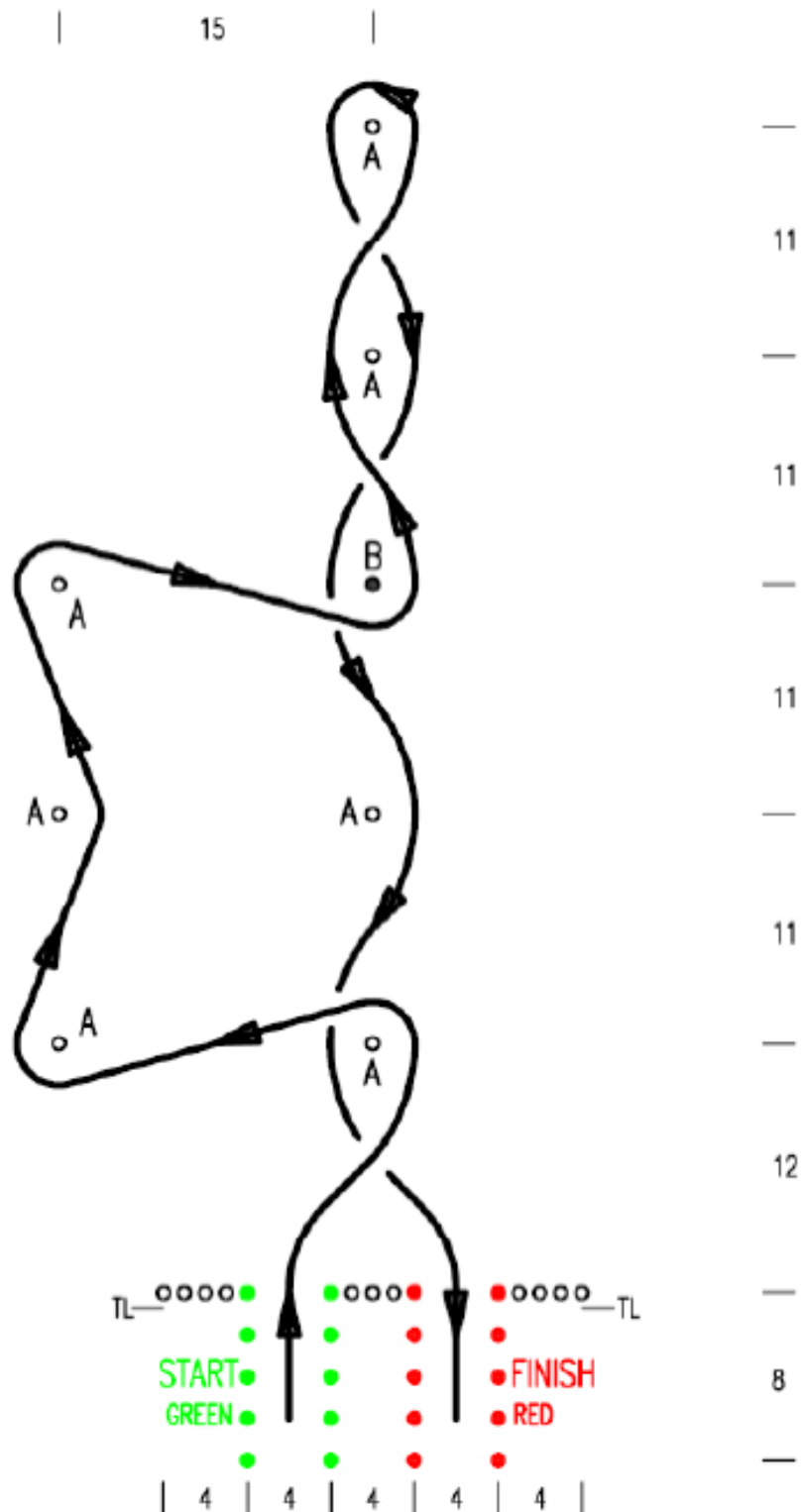

Timing line (0.5 - 1m) TL

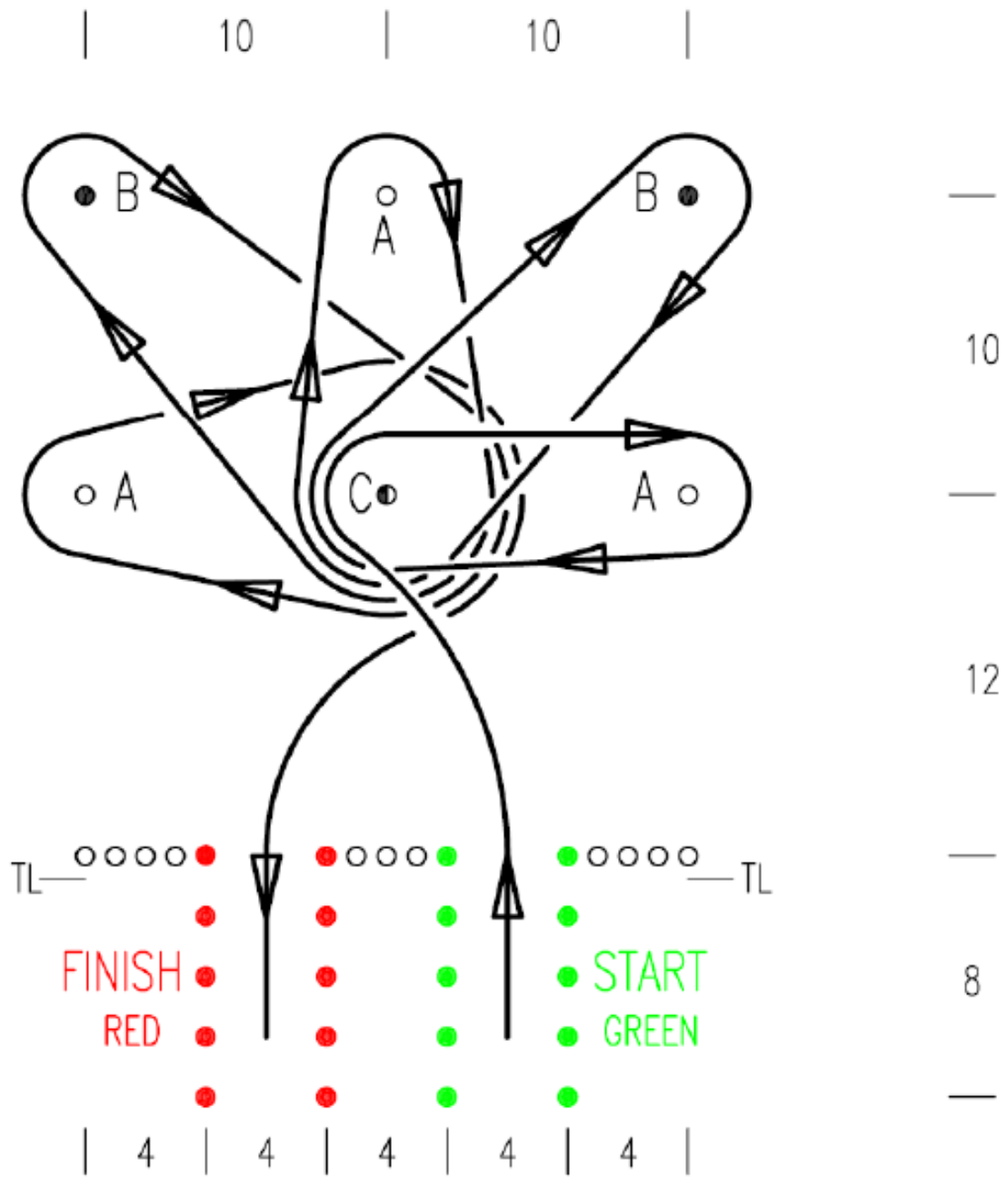
